As School Garden Project of Lane County comes to the close of our 2019 programming, an opportunity to reflect presents itself. The seeds of science knowledge and exploration have been planted in the minds of our students. In addition, we have tasted new vegetables and learned how to care for and tend a garden. SGP garden educators and volunteers have said a temporary goodbye to the children in our program until late fall and the start of new beginnings.

New Beginnings.

For many of SGP's students, having access to a yard or resources to plant a garden is nonexistent. School Garden Project of Lane County believes every child has the right to this opportunity. School gardens also present the opportunity for children to experience connections with multiple generations. Teachers, community volunteers, grandparents and parents are all present during our lessons. This experience is profoundly important due to the creation of social interactions that busy lives and technology can make difficult for children to experience.

As a Guy Lee Elementary third grade student stated recently after an SGP class, "I can't wait to go home and study plants instead of playing games on my tablet!" A 4th grade Bertha Holt Elementary School student stated, "One of my friends got to be in garden class last year and I waited all summer to be here! I can't believe we actually get to go to the secret garden now!"


