RESTORING: Children are still being impacted by the transition from virtual to in-person instruction. They need the additional support SGP provides now more than ever.



School Garden Project strives to help Lane County schools develop onsite vegetable gardens where we teach children science in the garden and the basics of growing food, using the garden as an outdoor laboratory. At the start of the pandemic, SGP began distributing activity kits to our community as a way for children to enjoy mindful learning from home. SGP formed a partnership with **Escudo Latino** to have kits distributed to families during CARES Food Pantry pick ups and tabling events. Each kit contains carefully crafted bilingual science and garden activities with detailed

In the summer of 2022, SGP delivered no cost activity kits to children in our community.








